16 -20	A	EXCELLENT : remarkable result, only a few minor deficiencies
15 - 16	B	VERY GOOD : above average results despite a number of shortcomings
13 - 14	C	GOOD : very decent work, with notable inadequacies
11 -12	D	SATISFACTORY : honest work but with significant omissions
10	E	FAIR : result satisfies the minimum criteria
08 - 09	FX	INSUFFICIENT : additional work is needed to grant credit
00 - 08	F	INSUFFICIENT : considerable amount of additional work is necessary
